Processing stocks as of July 1 are overall below 2022 levels and below the 3 year average, however if we exclude 2019-2020 during the pandemic current levels are on track with previous years. Although levels are higher than average in both Alberta and PEI, discussions with the provinces reveal they are confident these potatoes will be moved by mid-August out west and September out east, in time for new crop coming on.
